THE MOST UNIQUE POWER RATINGS IN THE COUNTRY

These Power Play Forecasts are the most unique in the country because they are based on Northcoast Sports' Private Power Ratings. Our ratings are unlike any computer rating, as we take into account all of the following: Strength of Opponents Individual Units (Rushing Offense and Defense, Passing Offense, & Defense, Scoring Offense and Defense, Garbage Yards, Weather, Injuries, Home Field Edge, and Successful Unbalanced Attacks). Here is how each is reflected:

Strength of Opponent: Our ratings do not just take the opposing team's overall power rating into account. For example, Team A's defense vs the rush was rated at 119. They faced Team B and allowed "just" 256 yds rushing and dropped 5 spots in the national overall defensive ratings. However, Power Plays took into account their potent Opponents run attack and had forecasted the Team A yielding 289 yds. Due to the fact they did better than the forecast, Power Plays raised their rating to 112 even though they slipped in the national (straight yardage) rankings. Next time an announcer on TV tells you that a certain team is #3 in the country vs the run you better check Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings and see how good a rush defense they really have! The top twenty ratings in Power Ratings for each offensive and defensive category will be listed in each week's issue of Power Plays.

Garbage yards: These are yards that a team gains or allows in the final minutes of a game when it has been decided. For example, Team A is ahead 63-0 and allows 93 yards passing for a TD vs its fourth string defense. These yards are counted into national ratings, but not in Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings!

Weather: If a game is played in miserable weather conditions and is low scoring, the straight statistics credit the defense with outstanding performances. Our Power Ratings reflect the conditions and do not give excess credit to the defenses.

Injuries: When Missouri played Vanderbilt in '13, Tigers QB James Franklin was injured early in the game. His backup, who had seen very little action (rFr), was not prepared and hit on 30%, 9-30 passes. The offensive coordinator simplified the offense. In the national statistics Vanderbilt's overall defense MOVED UP 8 NOTCHES. In the Power Ratings they went from #11 dropping out of the Top 15, as the poor performance WAS NOT reflective of an outstanding performance by the defense.

Home Field Edges: The weekly projection of yards and points is weighted with the home field factored in.

Successful Unbalanced Attacks: A few Seasons ago, Tulsa was held to 155 yards passing vs Houston. This dropped Tulsa in the national passing offense ratings & RAISED the Cougars in the pass defense ratings. In our ratings the two units remained rated around the same. Why? Tulsa rushed for 350 yards & DID NOT HAVE TO RELY ON THE PASS & when they did they hit 18 of 32. While Houston's pass defense looked good in the national ratings, only Northcoast Sports' Power Ratings reflected the TRUTH!

There you have it. More than just numbers, THESE RATINGS REFLECT the true strength of each unit and allow them to have the most accurate forecast of yards gained and points allowed in the country! No other rating system takes into account all the previous factors. Next time you hear that a team is rated third in the country in pass defense, just remember, yards are not everything and Northcoast Sports' Power Plays will show you how strong the team really is.

NORTHCOAST SPORTS PLUS OR MINUS POWER RATINGS

The Power Ratings listed below are not based on the Power Plays, they are based on last year's final computer power rating numbers with the pluses and minuses from the off season changes factored in. They are then adjusted during the course of the season based on the final score of the games that are played on a weekly basis. The Power Ratings listed below can be used for you as a base power ratings to forecast up coming lines and strength of opponents, etc. Once again, they are not based on Power Plays and they differ from what we have shown in recent years which has been our actual computer Power Ratings. These are Northcoast Sports Plus or Minus Power Ratings.

First meeting. This is a battle between the MAC and CUSA Champs. HC Jerry Mack did a phenomenal job turning KSU around. This is their first FBS Bowl game. WMich is making their first trip to the Myrtle Beach Bowl. The Broncos are just 2-8 SU but 5-5 ATS in bowls. Last year was HC Taylor's first bowl and they lost to South Alabama 30-23 (+9').

KSU was picked to finish 11th in the preseason by the CUSA Coaches. HC Mack built the roster with experienced lower level guys and it paid off. They nearly upset Wake Forest in the opener and after an 0-2 start they won 10 of their next 11 games. KSU lost at Jax St in the reg ssn meeting but rebounded and beat them in the CUSA Title game. They are 10-3 SU/ATS but only +2 ypg despite playing our #133 sked. QB Odom has an 18-6 ratio. They have a solid WR corps and a location edge. Their D has allowed 236 (5.7)

rush ypg the L4W.

HC Taylor has WMich in a bowl for the first time in 3 years. They were picked to finish 7th in the MAC this year. They started 0-3 and trailed Toledo 13-0 3Q but rallied to win and turned their season around. The Broncos won 9 of their last 10 games including the MAC Title game in a revenge spot vs Miami, OH. WMich has a dominant run game, led by RB Jalen Buckley (829, 4.8) and QB Broc Lowry has rushed for 940 (4.8) and 14 td's. WMich played the #108 sked and are +37 ypg. They've allowed 300 ypg and DE Nadame Tucker has 14.5 sacks. They have the edge in all 3 levels of defense, plus a solid ST's edge (#41 vs #69).

WMich has a huge edge on defense and they have Bowl experience. The Broncos come from the tougher conference as well. PP has WMich by a td and they are only laying 3'. The Broncos run offense will gash the Owls poor run D. We would play WMich anything up to a td so this is a strong play

irst meeting. This game was previously known as the St. Petersburg Bowl and Beef O'Brady's Bowl. Memphis played in the very first version of this bowl in 2008, a 41-14 loss to USF. NC State won here in 2014, 34-27 vs UCF. HC Silverfield left Memphis for Arkansas so DB Cch Reggie Howard is the Interim. NCSt has lost 4 straight bowls and HC Doeren is 3-6 SU/4-5 ATS in bowls.

Memphis was the favorite to win the AAC and considered a playoff contender. They started 6-0 including a win over Arkansas. QB Lewis missed their game at UAB. They were still -21' yet lost 31-24. They rebounded with wins over USF and Rice but fell apart late in the season and lost their last 3. Memphis was +59 ypg and +28 in their L/4 despite the 3 losses. QB Lewis has thrown for 2,567 (70%, 15-6) and is their #2 rusher with 613 (4.3). Their best OL, RT Travis Burke missed the finale and is ? here.

NCSt started 3-0 but lost 4 of their next 5 games. They won 3 of their last 4 to finish 7-5. Four of their losses were on the road vs ACC Champs Duke, Notre Dame, Pitt and Miami. They beat GTech, Virginia, FSU and UNC at home, plus had a road win over Wake Forest. NCSt is -26 ypg but played our #33 toughest scheduleThe Wolfpack are led by QB CJ Bailey (70%, 2884, 23-9, 215 rush) and RB Hollywood Smothers (939, 5.9). NCSt's Pass Defense is only #90 (63%, 21-8) but they played much better in their last 2 games.

NCSt has played the much tougher schedule (#33 vs #87) and they have a big coaching edge with Dave Doeren against an Interim HC. Memphis has a big edge on ST's (#53 vs #126). We think NCSt will be the more motivated team. Memphis collapsed down the stretch while NCSt won their last two including a 23 point win over rival UNC. PP has NCSt by 7 and they are laying 5'. We think the Wolfpack win but are concerned about potential opt outs on both sides

OK has had Bama's number in recent history as they've won 5 of the last 6 mtgs. This is a rematch of a week 12 meeting, won by OK 25-23 (+6). Bama actually had a 406-212 yd edge in that game but were -3 TO's including an 87 yd Pick-6 by CB Eli Bowen. LY Oklahoma was +14 and won 24-3. This is HC Venables first playoff trip while HC DeBoer led Washington to the Nat'l Title game in '23.

Bama had a shocking start to their season when they were upset at FSU 31-17. They won their next 8 including at Georgia and beat Vandy and Tennessee at home. After the loss to Oklahoma they were in a must win in the Iron Bowl and squeaked out a 27-20 victory. Bama put up a ssn low 7 pts/209 yards in the SEC Title rematch vs Georgia and lost 28-7. Ty Simpson has a 26-5 ratio but only 5-4 in their last 4 games. RB Jam Miller has been banged up but is expected to return for this game. Their defence allows inch 204 is expected to return for this game. Their defense allows just 284 pg and holds foes 88 ypg below their avg. Their ST's is a concern #74) and K Talty is just 13-20 this year.

We considered Oklahoma a legit playoff contender before the season despite a tough sked. They beat Michigan as part of a 5-0 start. QB Mateer wasn't 100% when they lost 23-6 vs Texas. They allowed a ssn high 34 pts in a loss to Ole Miss then won their last 4 games including road upsets over Tennessee and Bama. QB Mateer hasn't been the playmaker he was expected to be (62%, 12-10, 416 rush). They only rush for 124 (3.7). The Sooners have a typical Venables D, allowing just 274 ypg and holding foes 112 ypg below their avg but the offense put up 10 ypg less than foes allow on avg in SEC play.

PP calls for OK to win by 6 but we like Bama here. Instead we will go with PP's low scoring forecast and use the Under as our play here. The under is a combined 19-6 in Bama and Oklahoma games so it only makes sense!

First mtg. JMU in the CFP in 4th ssn in FBS. Dukes in postseason 3rd straight yr. They lost to AF (+1') in '23, 31-21, and beat WKU (+7), 27-17, LY. HC Bob Chesney took Holy Cross to playoffs from 19-23. Oregon has missed postseason twice this century ('04 & 16). Ducks lost Rose Bowl (CFP quarters) LY to Ohio St, 41-21. HC Lanning 2-1 SU & 1-2 ATS in the postseason.

JMU 12-1 after winning SBC. Dukes' lost at Louisville in gm they could have won and outscored opp 37-16 (+201ypg). However, their best wins are over ODU & Wazzu, so this is a step up in weight class. Program built on D and ground gm. RB Wayne Knight has rushed for 1,263 (6.6, 379 rec) & QB Alonza Barnett is a dual threat (60%, 21-8, 544 rush).Pass gm 94th and offense struggles when running gm stalls. Offense is good but D is elite. JMU holds opp 137ypg below their avg (#2 FBS!) and have not allowed more than 28pts. Dukes give up 2.5 ypc and 49.5% completions. This is an SBC D playing at P4 level. Chesney is coaching despite taking UCLA job.

Oregon is the highest rated at-large tm. They're also 12-1, only losing to #1 Indiana. At home, Ducks win by avg of 42-14 and 223 ypg QB Dante Moore has had a solid debut with 2,733 yds and 24-6 ratio. His receivers are banged up and the backs are a committee but TE Kenyon Sadiq (490, 12.6) is a star. This is the best D JMU will see all yr. Oregon holds opp 121ypg below their avg (#4 FBS) and gives up 3.2 ypc. The pass D is also solid, ranking #4 with 12-13 ratio. There are no areas where JMU can exploit Lanning's D. Both

Duck coordinators have taken HC jobs but will coach in the CFP. PP has Oregon 36-17 while outgaining JMU 434-234. We agree with the Oregon total, but don't believe Dukes can hit 17. Ducks have edge in every category and are +22 on our checklist. They'll force JMU into 3rd&long which is a terrible spot for Barnett. PP gives lean to JMU while we like Oregon by 21+ so this is a no play.

FORECAST: NO PLAY RATING: NO PLAY

Former SEC rivals have played 72 times. Ole Miss has won 12 straight and covered 3 straight incl Wk 4 this yr. First CFP gm for both. This is Ole Miss' 6th straight yr in postseason (3-2 SU & ATS) but 1st gm as HC for Pete Golding. Since '18, Tulane has only missed postseason in '21. HC Jon Sumrall 1-1 SU & ATS in bowls,

losing LY to Florida, 33-8, who he'll be coaching in '26.
Tulane is riding its best 4-yr run in program history. Sumrall has maintained what Willie Fritz built from '16-'23. Green Wave 11-2 and slowed UNT for their 2nd American title since '22. They lost at UTSA who almost never loses at home but also lost to Ole Miss, 45-10. They were outgained by 266yds and the QBs were 10-29 for 104 yds. Tulane has beaten NW, Duke & UNT but those were in New Orleans. QB Jake Retzlaff (62%, 14-6, 610 rush) is an avg passer, so the run gm must produce for the offense to be effective. Tulane's strength is the D. They hold opp 31ypg below avg (#43 FBS), allow 3.5 ypc, and lead the league with 34 sacks.

At 11-1, Ole Miss is having its best ssn ever, but they no longer have their architect, Lane Kiffin, who left for LSU. Golding was DC for 3 yrs and previously was Bama's DC. Rebs' only loss was at Georgia, 43-35, in gm they were outgained 510-351. Their best win was at #8 Oklahoma. At home, Ole Miss +23ppg and +233ypg. Offense gains 142ypg above opp avg (#1 FBS!) led by QB Trinidad Chambliss (66%, 18-3) and RB Kewan Lacy (1279, 5.0). Chambliss led D2 Ferris St to NC so he knows playoff stakes. D can be beaten but it takes a balanced attack which Tulane does not have. Rebs softer against the run (4.3 ypc) than the pass (182 ypg, 13-7 ratio).

Forecast has Ole Miss winning again but by closer margin. We agree. Green Wave D is peaking & Rebel offense will miss Kiffin. Retzlaff lacks downfield passing to beat an SEC D. Both tms will struggle to score so we're on the under and like Tulane with pts.

Miami is 3-2 all-time vs A&M. The home team won both meetings when they met in '22 and '23. This is both Mike Elko and Mario Cristobal's Playoff debut as HC. Cristobal was on Saban's staff when they played in the playoffs in '15 and '16. A&M won all 7 home games this year (+205 ypg).

UM nearly made the playoffs last year but were upset twice down the stretch and got left out. Cristobal had 15 starters back including transfer QB Carson Beck from UGA. The 'Canes opened 5-0 including a 27-24 win over Notre Dame which proved to be their ticket to the playoffs. They were upset by Louisville and SMU then won their last 4 but lost a convaluted playoff tie-breaker to 5 loss Duke and were 4 but lost a convaluted playoff tie-breaker to 5 loss Duke and were left out of the ACC Title game. The 'Canes are +144 ypg against our #43 sked. They have wins over 5 bowl eligible teams. Their offense avg 34 ppg/422 ypg. The D is their catalyst, allowing 278 ypg/14 ppg and they hold foes 123 ypg below their avg. They allow just 87 rush ypg led by stud DE's Bain (37 tkl, 4.5 sk) and Mesidor (7 sk). We felt A&M was a legit playoff contender this year with 15 starters back and in Mike Elko's 2nd year. Just like Miami, A&M's best win came against Notre Dame, but their's was in South Bend 41-40. A&M had a fortuitous SEC schedule where they missed all of the top half of the SEC until their loss at Texas. They started 11-0

of the top half of the SEC until their loss at Texas. They started 11-0 and we won our Underdog POW going against A&M in their finale at Texas. A&M avg 36 ppg/454 ypg and 105 ypg more than their foes allow. Their D allows 22 ppg/310 ypg and holds foes 69 ypg below their avg. They lead the nation with 41 sacks including 11.5 from DE Howell

The checklist to the left has A&M by a td and that's exactly where we have this game finishing but PP has Miami pulling the outright upset and the projected final score is near the Vegas Total so this is a no play.

These tms will be Pac-12 foes next yr. Wazzu leads 3-2, losing 26-23 in '21 and winning 49-28 in '24 behind 5 John Mateer td's. Cougs on 4gm bowl losing skid but covered LY's Holiday Bowl vs Syracuse. Interim HC Jesse Bobbit has taken over for Jimmy Rogers (lowa St). Utah St lost '23 Potato Bowl to Georgia St 45-22. HC Bronco Mendenhall's first bowl since '19. He's 7-7 SU & 8-6 ATS.

Mendenhall is off to a good start at USU, adding 2 wins to a tm that was 4-8 LY. Aggies 10-2 ATS (4-1 as fav), covering against A&M and Vandy and losing by just 1 to MWC champ Boise St. Their only ATS losses were road gms. This yr's rise has been led by an offense that averages 32 ppg and gains 44ypg above opp avg (#37 FBS). The catalyst is QB Bryson Barnes who leads with 733 rushing and has thrown for 2687 (60%, 18-4). Top WR Brandon Pegan is in the portal. The D allows 46ypg more than opp avg (#117 FBS) and gave

up 23 td passes but did shave 10ppg & 46ypg off last yr's numbers. Rogers also had a solid 1st ssn but used that to land the lowa St job. This is Bobbit's 1st gm at the helm. His D is a big reason Wazzu is 6-6 and 8-4 ATS (5-2 as a dog). Cougs lost by just 9 combined pts to Ole Miss, UVA & JMU, and did not lose a gm by more than Apts over final 2 months. Unlike USU, they win with D. WSU holds opp 99ypg below their avg (#12 FBS) and has allowed just 12.5 ppg over the last 8 wks! However, the offense ranks 121st at 315ypg and averages just 22ppg. Cougs have just 36 plays of 20+ yds so they're unlikely to stretch the USU defense. The offense runs through QB Zevi Eckhaus who's thrown for just 1760 (12-9 ratio, 337 rush)

Forecast calls for Wazzu to win 25-18 and outgain Utah St 399-347. WSU has gone Under the Total is 7 of their L/8 and we've been on board for most of those. Utah St has an explosive offense but WSU kept games vs Ole Miss, Virginia and James Madison under the Total and this number sits well under the projection!

This is the 9th meeting but first since 1981. Toledo just watched their HC, Jason Candle leave for UConn. QB Cch Robert Weiner is the Interim HC and they've already hired Mercer's Mike Jacobs to take over. LY Toledo upset Pitt 48-46 (+6') and the underdog has covered in Toledo's L/6 Bowl trips. Jeff Brohm is 5-2 SU/4-3 ATS in bowls. LY they beat Washington 35-34 despite significant opt outs including their starting QB.

On paper, Toledo was the best team in the MAC this year. They only lost to Kentucky by 8 in their opener. They blew a 13-0 lead at WMich and 21-0 lead at BG. Their only other loss was at Wash St. The Rockets won their last 4 games to finish 8-4 but lost the tie-breaker for the MAC Title game to Miami, OH despite a headto-head win. Toledo avg 32 ppg/422 ypg. Their D is #3 in the FCS, allowing just 12 ppg/249 ypg but they did face one of the weakest schedules in CFB (#127).

UL started 4-0 but there were concerns brewing in some of those performances. JMU held UL to 264 yards. They came back from a performances. JMU neid Ut to 264 yards. They came back from a 17 pt deficit to beat Pitt. UL had a 383-237 yd edge at Virginia but lost by a fg. They upset Miami on the road the following week and were in the mix for the ACC Title game at 7-1. UL lost 3 straight to slip to 7-4. They were down to a w/o RB and missing other key starters yet still thrashed Kentucky 41-0. UL is +89 ypg and they holy yr below their Dallows just 21 ppg/300 ypg and they holy their page 18 to word yet on if 1 will got apply 6 foes 79 ypg below their avg. No word yet on if L'ville will get any of their nijured players, such as RB's Isaac and Keyjuan Brown. We do know that WR Chris Bell (917, 12.7) is out Wel torn ACL.

Both teams could have significant players opt out. Toledo lost their HC but the players will want to impress their new HC. LY Toledo knocked off Pitt, now they have a chance to upset Louisville. PP's only has UL by 4 and they are laying over a td. Play the Rockets!

WKU has won all 4 mtgs from '12-'20. WKU has bowled all 6 yrs under HC Tyson Helton. They're 4-2 SU & 3-3 ATS incl a 44-23 New Orleans Bowl win over So Alabama (-3') in '22. Southern Miss bowling for 1st time since '22. Blake Anderson has replaced Charles Huff (Memphis) as HC. He was Huff's OC. Anderson 3-6 SU & ATS in bowls and coached Arkansas St to New Orleans Bowl loss in '15.

Helton is 56-36 here but has yet to win CUSA title. This yr's 8-4 tm (9-3ATS) had new look incl just 2 returning starters on D. After winning their 1st MAC title since 1968, Ohio missed making the league champ gm this yr. Earlier this month, Smith took a leave of absence so DC Hauser will coach here. Bobcats beat WV & Miami OH, and all 4 losses came on the road. They've used a familiar blueprint of ground gm and D. QB Parker Navarro is a dual-threat senior (61%, 14-10, 839 rush) and Sieh Bangura leads the MAC with 1243 yds (5.6).
