### COLLEGE FOOTBALL BEST BETS

#### CINCINNATI - 29½ Over Temple by 20

Friday Night Game

The Temple Owls and Cincinnati Bearcats meet Friday in AAC week 6 college football action at Nippert Stadium. The Temple Owls look for a statement win after winning three of their last four games. The Cincinnati Bearcats haven't lost a regular season game since December of 2019.

The Temple Owls have lost five of their last six road games. D'Wan Mathis is completing 61.9 percent of his passes for 762 yards, five touchdowns and one interception. Jose Bardon and Randle Jones have combined for 520 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Amad Anderson Jr. has nine receptions. The Temple Owls ground game is averaging 129.6 yards per contest, and Edward Saydee leads the way with 165 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Temple is allowing 30.2 points and 313.4 yards per game. MJ Griffin leads the Temple Owls with 29 tackles, William Kwenkeu has three sacks and Manny Walker has two interceptions.

The Cincinnati Bearcats haven't lost a home game since November of 2017. Desmond Ridder is completing 63.5 percent of his passes for 1,045 yards, nine touchdowns and two interceptions. Alec Pierce and Tyler Scott have combined for 466 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Michael Young Jr. has 12 receptions. The Cincinnati Bearcats ground game is averaging 146 yards per contest, and Jerome Ford leads the way with 367 yards and six touchdowns. Defensively, Cincinnati is allowing 14.5 points and 309.3 yards per game. Deshawn Pace leads the Cincinnati Bearcats with 32 tackles, Darrian Beavers has two sacks and Arquon Bush had two interceptions.

The Owls are 35-16 ATS in their last 51 conference games and 4-9 ATS in their last 13 games overall. The Bearcats are 5-2 ATS in their last 7 home games and 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games overall. The over is 6-1-1 in Owls last 8 games in October. The under is 12-5 in Bearcats last 17 home games.

The Cincinnati Bearcats are as good as advertised and are going to start getting that sort of respect from oddsmakers. However, this is a bit of a letdown spot for the Bearcats after beating Notre Dame on the road. Cincinnati also isn't a team we find often in these massive favorite roles, and they're 2-6 against the spread when favored by 28 or more points since 2014. In addition, the Owls are 5-0 ATS in their last 5 meetings. Also, Temple has scored a bunch of points this season and their defense is fourth in the country against the pass. Lots of points on a quick turnaround. I like this spot for the Owls, so **take Temple and the boatload of points.**

## **Virginia + 3 Over LOUISVILLE by 7**

The Virginia Cavaliers need a win after splitting their last four games. The Louisville Cardinals look for a win after winning three of their last four games.

The Virginia Cavaliers have lost five of their last six road games. Brennan Armstrong is completing 64.7 percent of his passes for 1,973 yards, 14 touchdowns and four interceptions. Dontayvion Wicks and Billy Kemp IV have combined for 897 receiving yards and eight touchdowns while Keytaon Thompson has 20 receptions. The Virginia Cavaliers ground game is averaging 128 yards per contest, and Wayne Taulapapa leads the way with 143 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Virginia is allowing 27.6 points and 412.8 yards per game. Nick Jackson leads the Virginia Cavaliers with 46 tackles, Noah Taylor has three sacks and Anthony Johnson has one interception.

The Louisville Cardinals have won their last four home games. Malik Cunningham is completing 63.8 percent of his passes for 1,307 yards, seven touchdowns and two interceptions. Marshon Ford and Jordan Watkins have combined for 456 receiving yards and two touchdowns while Ahmari Huggins-Bruce has nine receptions. The Louisville Cardinals ground game is averaging 169.6 yards per contest, and Jalen Mitchell leads the way with 331 yards and one touchdown. Defensively, Louisville is allowing 28.2 points and 435.6 yards per game. C.J. Avery leads the Louisville Cardinals with 36 tackles, Yasir Abdullah has four sacks and Kei'Trel Clark has three interceptions.

The Cavaliers are 2-5 ATS in their last 7 games on fieldturf and 8-3 ATS in their last 11 games overall. The Cardinals are 8-3 ATS in their last 11 home games and 9-23-1 ATS vs. a team with a winning record. The under is 5-1 in Cavaliers last 6 games overall. The over is 8-2 in Cardinals last 10 home games.

The Virginia Cavaliers aren't a great football team, but they've had an extra week to prepare for this game and they're quietly second in college football in passing yards and seventh in total offense. The Louisville Cardinals have more balance offensively and are usually good at home, but they're not good defensively and have found themselves in shootouts in four of their first five games. Louisville is 110th in passing yards allowed, which isn't what you want to see when going up against Virginia.

Also, the Cavaliers are 5-2 ATS in their last 7 meetings. **Take the +3 and the Cavs.**

## **West Virginia + 3 Over BAYLOR by 7**

The West Virginia Mountaineers are fresh off a matchup versus Texas Tech. In that game West Virginia lost a close one. As for Baylor, they played Oklahoma State in their last game. The Bears ended up falling by 10 points.

West Virginia started their season on a down note, falling 30-24 to Maryland. The Mountaineers picked up steam over the next couple of games, taking out LIU 66-0 and Virginia Tech 27-21. West Virginia then took a heartbreaker loss against Oklahoma 16-13 in game four.

Last weekend versus Texas Tech, West Virginia made a strong comeback to tie things up at 17-all heading into the fourth quarter. The Mountaineers eventually fell 23-20, however. QB Jarret Doege put up 318 yards with a TD, and Leddie Brown had 17 carries for 57 yards and a score.

Over on the Baylor side, they managed to beat Texas State 29-20 in their opener this season, then destroyed Texas Southern 66-7 in the next game. The Bears would follow that up with a blowout win over Kansas 45-7 and a close victory over Iowa State 31-29.

In their matchup versus Oklahoma State, the Bears couldn't score in the first half during a 24-14 loss.

Gerry Bohanon managed 173 yards on 13-of-27 passing, and Abram Smith had 97 yards and a TD on 10 carries. Drew Estrada led the receivers with 88 yards on six catches.

The Mountaineers are 5-1 ATS in their last six after an ATS loss and 2-5 ATS in their last seven road games.

Meanwhile, the Bears are 16-3-2 ATS in their last 21 after an ATS loss and 6-15-1 ATS versus a team with a losing record.

The Mountaineers had a good second half against Texas Tech last weekend but couldn't bridge the gap. WVU put up 424 yards with 6.8 yards per play and 22 first downs and overall were good offensively but under performed get it in the red zone.

The Mountaineers are getting better every week and they took Texas Tech and Oklahoma right down to the wire. As for Baylor, they gave up 401 yards to Oklahoma State and had trouble getting their own offense going. The Bears notched just 10 first downs and also had nine penalties. Looking at the trends, WVU is 6-2 ATS in their last eight after a road loss. Baylor is 0-4-1 ATS in their last five in October. Looking at the power ratings of all the opponents these two teams played, it's obvious that the Mountaineers have played a much tougher schedule. **Take West Virginia + 3.**

## **Texas Tech + 2 Over T.C.U. by 7 & Over 61 by 8**

The TCU Horned Frogs need a win to get a game above a .500 record. The Texas Tech Red Raiders look for another win to build on their solid 4-1 record.

The TCU Horned Frogs have won three of their last four road games. Max Duggan is completing 63.2 percent of his passes for 899 yards, eight touchdowns and two interceptions. Taye Barber and Quentin Johnston have combined for 368 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Derius Davis has 13 receptions. The TCU Horned Frogs ground game is averaging 197 yards per contest, and Zach Evans leads the way with 443 yards and three touchdowns. Defensively, TCU is allowing 27.3 points and 397.3 yards per game. Tre'Vius Hodges-Tomlinson leads the TCU Horned Frogs with 22 tackles, Dylan Horton has two sacks and Dee Winters has one interception.

The Texas Tech Red Raiders have won four straight home games. Tyler Shough is completing 69.6 percent of his passes for 872 yards, six touchdowns and three interceptions. Erik Ezukanma and Kaylor Geiger have combined for 720 receiving yards and two touchdowns while Loic Fouonji has five receptions. The Texas Tech Red Raiders ground game is averaging 144 yards per contest, and Tahj Brooks leads the way with 284 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, Texas Tech is allowing 30.8 points and 386.8 yards per game. Colin Schooler leads the Texas Tech Red Raiders with 45 tackles, Jaylon Hutchings has three sacks and Marquis Waters has one interception.

The TCU Horned Frogs are not only coming off back-to-back losses, but they've had issues stopping the run and they're 85th in scoring defense. The Texas Tech Red Raiders bounced back nicely with a big road win in West Virginia, and they have a top-25 passing attack that can score points in a hurry. We also can't ignore the fact this is the first road game of the season for TCU. I hardly call it a road game, it's a short bus ride down Rt. 360 from Ft Worth to Jerry's World and TCU may have more fans at the game. Hence the two points for Texas Tech.

The Red Raiders are 4-1 ATS in their last 5 games as an underdog. The over is 5-2 in Horned Frogs last 7 road games. The over is 7-3-1 in Red Raiders last 11 games in October. I expect these trends to continue based on their stats this year. Therefore, **take Texas Tech + 2 and Over 61.**

## S. MISS U. + 2 Over UTEP by 7

UTEP just finished up a game versus Old Dominion. In that one the Miners bagged a seven-point win. As for Southern Miss, they played Rice in their last game. The Eagles ended up losing by five there.

UTEP came out of the gate strong this year, posting a big 30-3 win over New Mexico State in the opener and a 38-28 win over Bethune-Cookman in week two. The Miners couldn't handle Boise State in a 54-13 loss in the third game, but then took out New Mexico 20-13 on September 25.

In last weekend's matchup versus Old Dominion, the Miners put up points in all four quarters during a 28-21 victory. QB Gavin Hardison had 191 yards and two scores on 10-of-20 passing, and Deion Hankins had 70 yards and a TD on 22 carries.

Over on the Eagles' side, they were blown out by South Alabama in their opener 31-7 but then managed a 37-0 shutout win over Grambling State in week two. Southern Miss would then fall to Troy 21-9 and to Alabama 63-14 over their next two games.

In the game against Rice, Southern Miss trailed 10-7 at the break and couldn't get over the hump and took a 24-19 loss. QB Jake Lange had 304 yards with one TD and three picks. Frank Gore Jr. led the rush on 17 carries for 79 yards.

The Miners are 4-1 ATS in their last five conference games and 4-1 ATS in their last five in October. UTEP is also 7-3 ATS in their last 10 overall.

Southern Miss is 3-7 ATS in their last 10 on turf and 3-7 ATS in their last 10 at home. The Eagles are 3-8 ATS in their last 11 in October.

The Miners were pretty well-matched against Old Dominion, and it was a tight game most of the way. UTEP finished with 333 total yards, 17 first downs and a 9-of-18 mark on third and fourth downs.

As for Southern Miss, they out-gained Rice 378-325 and had 21 first downs to the Owls' 15. What did the Eagles in were penalties (10 for 90 yards) and turnovers (four picks). I like the fact that Southern Miss have played much stiffer competition. Let me reiterate, they outgained Rice and QB Jake Lange had 304 yards with one TD. If they're not too banged up after playing Alabama, **they should get a home dog win in this spot.**

## PRO FOOTBALL BEST BETS

### **Green Bay - 3 Over CINCINNATI by 11**

The Green Bay Packers look to build on their three-game winning streak. The Cincinnati Bengals shoot for a statement win to improve to 4-1 on the season.

Aaron Rodgers is completing 64.5 percent of his passes for 897 yards, eight touchdowns and two interceptions. Davante Adams and Randall Cobb have combined for 500 receiving yards and three touchdowns while Aaron Jones has 13 receptions. The Green Bay Packers ground game is averaging 92.5 yards per contest, and Jones leads the way with 206 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Green Bay is allowing 25 points and 311.5 yards per game. De'Vondre Campbell leads the Green Bay Packers with 40 tackles, Rashan Gary has 1.5 sacks and Eric Stokes has one interception.

The Cincinnati Bengals have split their last six home games. Joe Burrow is completing 72.9 percent of his passes for 988 yards, nine touchdowns and four interceptions. Ja'Marr Chase and Tyler Boyd have combined for 556 receiving yards and five touchdowns while CJ Uzomah has nine receptions. The Cincinnati Bengals ground game is averaging 98 yards per contest, and Joe Mixon leads the way with 353 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Cincinnati is allowing 18.8 points and 323 yards per game. Logan Wilson leads the Cincinnati Bengals with 40 tackles, BJ Hill has three sacks and Chidobe Awuzie has three pass deflections.

The Packers are 5-1 ATS in their last 6 games in October and 6-2 ATS in their last 8 games overall. The Bengals are 5-2 ATS in their last 7 home games and 7-3 ATS in their last 10 games on fieldturf. The over is 6-2 in Packers last 8 games overall. The under is 4-1 in Bengals last 5 games overall. The underdog is 4-0 ATS in their last 4 meetings.

It's hard to turn down the Packers and the reasonable line here. The Packers look like they've found their rhythm with three straight wins and a defense that's ranked sixth in total defense. The Bengals are off to a strong start, but it's important to remember all three of their wins have come against teams with a combined record of 2-10. Nevertheless, they're a covering machine at home but it's offset by the fact that the Green Bay Packers have won five of their last seven road games. I'm not totally convinced that the Bengals are up to Green Bay standards. Although, on any given Sunday right? But, until proven otherwise, give me the explosive deep threat Packers and the reasonable chalk.

### **NY Giants + 7½ Over DALLAS by 3**

The Giants are coming off an overtime victory over the Saints in week four. As for the Cowboys, they topped the Panthers last weekend to move to 3-1 on the young season.

New York had a tough matchup against a pretty good Denver team in their opener, and ultimately fell 27-13. The Giants would drop their next two games, losing 30-29 in a tough one to Washington and then 17-14 in another rough game versus the Falcons.

The Giants managed a win in overtime last weekend versus the Saints 27-21. QB Daniel Jones put up 402 yards with two touchdowns and a pick, and Saquon Barkley rushed 13 times for 52 yards and a TD. Kenny Golladay added 116 receiving yards on six grabs.

Over on the Cowboys' side, they took on the Buccaneers in their opener and ended up falling 31-29 in a tight game. Dallas would find their form over the next three outings, beating the Chargers 20-17, the Eagles 41-21 and the Panthers 36-28.

In the win over the Panthers, Dallas scored 20 points in the third quarter alone. QB Dak Prescott put up 188 yards with four touchdowns on 14-of-22 passing and Ezekiel Elliott rushed for 143 yards and a score. Amari Cooper chipped in three catches for 69 yards and a TD.

The obvious pick is to stick with America's team ..... Dallas, as what John Q Public will surely do. The Cowboys have found a nice offensive rhythm in their last few games, and they're coming off a really good performance. Dallas put up 433 yards of offense with 245 coming on the ground as Zeke and Pollard found large holes to run through. The Cowboys averaged 7.7 yards per play, posted 24 first downs and took care of the ball with zero turnovers. The Cowboys are 4-0 ATS in their last four overall and 6-1 ATS in the last seven on turf. Dallas is 4-1 ATS in their last five following a straight-up win.

As for the Giants, the win against the Saints was nice and showed what the team can do when they're effective. New York had 402 passing yards in that one, averaging 8.1 yards per play with 21 first downs. Those numbers are distinct improvements over previous games. Note that the GMen are a superlative 5-0 ATS in their last five versus the NFC East and 5-1 ATS in the last six in October. New York is a remarkable 20-6 ATS in their last 26 road games as well. I like the Giants to be very competitive in this matchup. As a matter of fact, they've always played the Boys tough, so I'm calling for a possible upset. I'm not going insane, I want the 7 and a hook in my pocket, to feel safer if it goes into overtime. **So it's Giants + 7½.**

## **PITTSBURGH - 1 Over Denver by 8**

Denver is coming off a 16-point loss to the Ravens in week four. It was their first defeat of the season. As for the Steelers, they played the Packers last weekend and lost by 10 points.

Denver looked solid in their first three games and had it working on both sides of the ball. The Broncos opened with a 27-13 win over the Giants, then took out the Jaguars 23-13. Week three was another win for Denver, this time 26-0 over the Jets.

Denver's modest win streak was halted by the Ravens last weekend in a 23-7 defeat. QB Drew Lock put up 113 yards with an interception on 12-of-21 passing. Melvin Gordon added 56 yards on nine carries and Courtland Sutton had 47 yards on three grabs.

Over on the Steelers' side, they opened up their 2021 campaign with a nice 23-16 win over the Bills on the road. Pittsburgh returned home and dropped their next two games, however. The Steelers lost 26-17 to the Raiders and 24-10 to the Bengals.

In week four versus the Packers, it was another loss for Pittsburgh—this time 27-17. QB Ben Roethlisberger put up 232 yards with a TD and a pick, while Najee Harris rushed 15 times for 62 yards and a score. Diontae Johnson led the receivers on 92 yards and a touchdown.

The Broncos are 4-1 ATS in their last five overall and 4-1 ATS versus a team with a losing record. Denver is also 4-1 ATS in their last five road games. Meanwhile, the Steelers are 6-1 ATS in their last seven in week five and 53-26-2 ATS in the last 81 in October. Pittsburgh is 1-4 ATS in their last five overall as well.

Looks like these teams are going in opposite directions. Denver is coming off a 16-point loss to the Ravens in week four. It was their first defeat of the season. As for the Steelers, they played the Packers last weekend and lost by 10 points.

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Pittsburgh needs a good bounce-back effort on both sides of the ball. The Steelers gave up 367 total yards last weekend, along with 23 first downs and a 9-of-15 mark on third-down tries. Pittsburgh gave up a couple of turnovers and had just 62 rush yards themselves. As for Denver, they were throttled by a tough Ravens team last game, posting 254 total yards and 15 first downs. The Steelers have their backs against the Steel Curtain. ## **LAS VEGAS - 5 Over Chicago by 13**

The Chicago Bears and the Las Vegas Raiders meet in week 5 NFL action from Allegiant Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

The Chicago Bears will look to build on their 24-14 win over Detroit from their last matchup. Justin Field has thrown for 342 yards and a pair of picks on 46.1% passing while David Montgomery leads the Bears in rushing with 309 yards and a pair of scores on the ground. Darnell Mooney leads Chicago's receivers with 226 receiving yards while Allen Robinson II has 149 receiving yards. On defense, Roquan Smith has a team-high 40 tackles and a pair of sacks while Robert Quinn has a team-high 4.5 sacks and Khalil Mack has 4 sacks as well this season.

The Las Vegas Raiders will attempt to bounce back from a 28-14 loss at the hands of the Los Angeles Chargers last time out. Derek Carr's thrown for 1,399 yards, 8 touchdowns and 3 interceptions while Peyton Barber leads the Raiders in rushing with 143 rushing yards. Henry Ruggs III, Darren Waller, Hunter Renfroe and Bryan Edwards all have 200+ receiving yards for the Raiders as well this season. On defense, Denzel Perryman leads the Raiders with 36 total tackles while Solomon Thomas has a team-high 2.5 sacks.

Chicago is 2-6 ATS in their last 8 road games and 0-4 ATS in their last 4 games as an underdog while the under is 5-0 in their last 5 games in October. Las Vegas is 3-7 ATS in their last 10 games overall and 1-4 ATS in their last 5 games as a home favorite while the over is 5-0 in their last 5 games following a loss.

Well, the Bears got in the win column, great. It was still against the Lions and if we're being honest, the Bears caught all the breaks which helped them jump out to a large lead. Chucky is ticked off after being humiliated in primetime by a division rival. I just don't see any way that the Bears hang here.
